Welcome to the 16th Annual Hyde Park Jazz Festival.

We hope you enjoy this free two-day celebration of jazz, creativity, and community on the South Side of Chicago. We are so pleased to welcome you to all of the incredible venues partnering with us this year!

The Hyde Park Jazz Festival was created in late 2006 when cultural leaders on the South Side met with the Hyde Park Jazz Society to develop an annual event that would bring new audiences into the many arts and culture venues in Hyde Park and celebrate jazz's great legacy and bright future on Chicago's South Side. We are tremendously grateful to all of our sponsors, donors, and venue partners for their continued support.

Now in its 16th year, the 2022 two-day Festival includes 37 free performances/programs! These concerts represent the creative diversity in Chicago jazz and feature some of the most compelling emerging and venerable artists on the national and international scene. In addition to performances and other programs, the festival includes local cuisine, artisan pop-up shops, and picnic areas on the Midway.

The Festival continues its Commissioning Program this year! We are extremely proud to be commissioning the great Chicago pianist and composer, Miguel de la Cerna, who is de-

veloping a new suite of music for his phenomenal ensemble.

And, we could not be more excited to share that after 2 years of postponement, we will present *Hear in Now + QWANQWA: Weaving Threads of Sound*, an international collaboration supported by the MacArthur Foundation International Fund bringing Ethiopian musicians to Chicago to perform with Hear in Now. Musicians include: Endris Hassen (masinqo), Kaethe Hostetter (violin), Bubu Teklemariam (bass krar), Selamnesh Zemene (vocals) Misale Legesse (kebero), Tomeka Reid (cello), Silvia Bolognesi (bass), Mazz Swift (violin), Eddy Kwon (violin), Chad Taylor (drums/percussion). The project is an incredibly special exploration of Afro-Diasporic musical traditions. The Ethiopian musicians have overcome significant logistical challenges to be here and we could not be more thrilled to welcome all of them to Chicago. Don't miss this very special collaboration!

Recent years have presented enormous challenges for us all, with a global pandemic, natural disasters,

and continued gun violence in our community. It has also been a time of resilience and creativity, all of which is evident in the Hyde Park Jazz Festival community of musicians and in all of you who come to listen and support them.

The Hyde Park Jazz Festival would not be possible without the support of our nearly 200 volunteers. 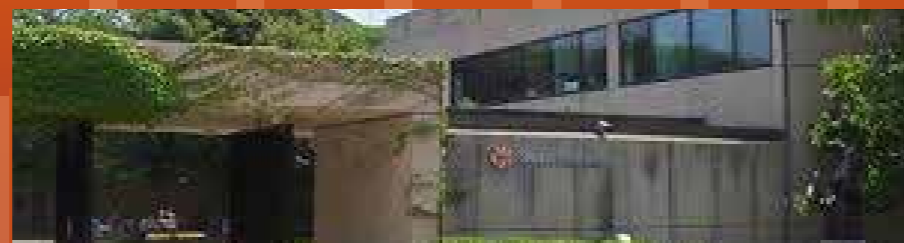

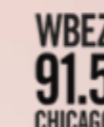
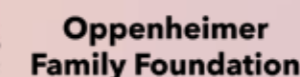
